



Mol nach emol - Giving a second life to school materials

The project **Mol nach emol**, focused on integrating the circular economy into the education system, has now established itself in Luxembourg. The project reevaluates school materials and aims to incorporate more sustainable practices in schools and children's homes. The fundamental pillars of the project are reusing, raising awareness, educating and inclusion.

A reuse project

SIVÉC resource center collects 6,600 tons of materials annually. A large part of it is in very good condition, but is still destined to be incinerated. Faced with this reality, SIVÉC, EBL, SDK, Fondation Kräizbiérg, Oeuvre Nationale de Secours Grande-Duchesse Charlotte and CK have joined their forces to promote the reuse of school materials in good condition that are discarded or undervalued. It helps giving the school materials a second life. Thanks to collection points in different schools and at the partnerships', we contribute to waste prevention and entire classrooms can benefit from these resources for free.

A change in mindset

More than just a revaluation operation, **Mol nach emol** aims to transform perceptions of consumption and the value of objects. **Mol nach emol** hopes to bring about a change in how we conceive and use school materials. This initiative sensitizes students to rethink their daily relationship with objects, promoting sustainable practices from a young age. The project thus embodies the circular economy in schools and households, making its educational approach apparent. SIVÉC, EBL, SDK, and Fondation Kräizbiérg hope to transform resources into sustainable opportunities.



Acting together for the environment and society

Furthermore, **Mol nach emol** also positions itself as a social project. Fondation Kräizbiérg, offering a life plan for people with physical disabilities, takes charge of collecting and processing materials. All materials deposited at the collection boxes ornated with a small world of characters, are sent to Fondation Kräizbiérg. In their workshops, materials are sorted, cleaned, disinfected, and pencils are sharpened. These materials are then integrated into personalized recycled kits, ready to be reused sustainably while contributing to the circular economy.

The Project **Mol nach emol** encourages the community to actively participate in this ecological initiative by depositing their unused school materials at dedicated collection points. By doing so, citizens contribute to environmental preservation and offer others the opportunity to benefit from educational resources without using new raw materials.
